Pikes Peak Chapter Resumes In-Person Meetings

On Saturday, September 18, 2021, The Pikes Peak Sons of the American Revolution (PPSAR) chapter met for just the second time since the onset of COVID, as it resumed activities after its summer hiatus.

The day began with the PPSAR conducting its first in-person meeting of the fall season, and only its second since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic in early 2020. The meeting was conducted at the PPSAR's traditional in-person location at the Double Tree Hotel in Colorado Springs.

Despite the challenges presented during the past 18 months, the PPSAR has actually expanded its membership substantially, from 90 members at the end of 2019, to 109 members as of the end of September 2021. That's a Chapter membership increase of over 21%! Recognizing its newest members as well as some of its long-time members was a

Ruby Morewood Honored with Martha Washington Medal

On Thursday, August 26th, the Pikes Peak Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution (PPSAR) had the distinct honor and privilege to recognize a lady who has performed superb support to local veterans in several local Veterans Homes. For over four years, Ruby Morewood has been crocheting – and donating – over 400 lap robes (blankets) for veterans.

It all started in 2017, when she learned about veterans who needed the lap robes because they would get cold sitting in their wheelchairs. The PPSAR agreed to take delivery of the lap robes and donate them to three southern Colorado veteran's centers located in Walsenburg, Florence, and Monte Vista. Ruby and the PPSAR were joined by a local troop of Girl Scouts and a local chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution in 2017, with both organizations making and taking donations of blankets to support the project. Ruby's lap robes have also been used by the Veterans for Foreign Wars (VFW) for Honor Flights out of

Denver. Additionally, Ruby has donated lap robes at the Brookdale Senior Living community (where she resides) on the south side of Colorado Springs. The most recent delivery of 35 lap robes was conducted by Chapter President Rick Prescott and his wife to the Spanish Peaks Veterans Home in July.

Ruby has visited the centers in Walsenburg and Florence, where she received VIP tours of the facilities and appreciation from both staff and residents.

The award presented by the Rick Prescott, President, Pikes Peak Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution was the Martha Washington Medal, among the highest awards given by the Sons of the American Revolution to non-members. The medal is presented to a woman in recognition of outstanding service to the Sons of the American Revolution.

Just prior to the summer hiatus, Pikes Peak Chapter Color Guard members David Mann, Scott Tanner, Sid Hughes and Curt Jenkins went to the Chipeta Elementary School on Colorado Springs' west side for their annual presentation on a soldier's life during the Revolutionary War.

The Chipeta Elementary School curriculum places considerable emphasis on U.S. history. When teaching about colonial life, the break with Great Britain and the war for independence, the teachers invite the Pikes Peak chapter to send its members to help bring history to life for the students.

"It's good to be back," said Scott Tanner, noting that the event was cancelled last year due to the COVID-19 shut-down. "This is perhaps our most important outreach of the year because we're helping the next generation learn what 'liberty' really means." Tanner was accompanied by his daughter, Sydney Tanner, a long-time supporter of Pikes Peak chapter activities. She attended the event wearing the period dress of a "camp follower" and spoke to the important role of women during the Revolutionary War.

In addition to Pikes Peak members wearing their uniforms, they also brought their wooden "Patriot Chest" full of replica accoutrements that soldiers of the period would have had with them: knives and forks, a quill pen, lanterns, a field drum and, of course, the ubiquitous musket.

"Seeing the flintlock spark is like seeing magic for the kids," says Mann. "Had we been able to be outside, we would have put some powder in the breach and raised a little smoke, which is a lot of fun to see."

A steady (and uncommon) morning rain forced everyone to remain in the school, but enthusiasm among the students was not dampened in the least. Most dressed up in Colonial-era clothing and all were keen to get their hands on all the kit from the soldier's knapsack.

The Chipeta Elementary administration thanked the Pikes Peak chapter with a donation and an invitation to come back again next year.
